2024 Annual Report

Consolidation, regular publication and expansion

In 2024 SJORANM moved from its inaugural phase to regular year-round operation. The journal received 30 submissions and published 29 articles across 11 issues. The published author community expanded markedly and the article mix broadened toward original research and case-based scholarship.

Publication profile

The 2024 output included 14 case reports, 11 research articles, two letters and communications, one review and one contribution in the Specials section. Every published article has a DOI.

Assessment

The year established a dependable publication rhythm and a broader contributor base. It also showed that growth needed to be accompanied by more consistent metadata, clearer public policy documentation and more complete capture of editorial activity inside OJS.

Priorities

- Maintain complete affiliation, country, ORCID and ROR metadata.
- Record external review assignments and decisions consistently in OJS.
- Publish clear governance, funding and editorial-independence information.

Method and interpretation

This report uses the OJS Articles Report exported on 26 September 2026. Submissions are grouped by Date submitted and publications by First published. The figures describe calendar-year activity and are not cohort acceptance or conversion rates. Country totals reflect the metadata stored in OJS. Reliable annual reviewer and comparable usage statistics were not available and are therefore not inferred.

Institutional context

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
